Course title	Health and Social Care (BTEC Level 3 Diploma)
Awarding body / course code	Edexcel / RA827
Content	The course is comprised of 120 credits to be studied over the two years. Students will complete work experience as a full unit over the 2years. Successful completion of this course will give students the equivalent of 2 A level grades. The course provides the grades and good grounding for students to progress on to Health & Social Care programmes and other related subjects at university.

Teaching methods	This includes work placement, trips, speakers, research projects, practicals, presentations, independent study and group work.
Assessment	BTEC Nationals are not exam based. Students have to study real-life, work based case studies and complete projects and assignments, which contribute to achieving each unit studied. Opportunities include physiotherapy, midwifery, radiologist, social work, teaching, nursing, medicine, counselling etc.
Career options	The qualification is designed to be flexible to reflect the individual's career aspiration. There is an emphasis on employment opportunities, so that students can choose to progress into specific area of work.
