<b>Course title</b>	<b>Health and Social Care (BTEC Level 3 Diploma – Year 13 only)</b>
<b>Awarding body &amp; course code</b>	<b>Edexcel / RA827</b>

Successful completion of this course will give students the equivalent of 2 A level grades. <b>Teaching methods</b>	This includes work placement, trips, speakers, research projects, practicals, presentations, independent study and group work.
<b>Assessment</b>	BTEC Nationals are not exam based. Students have to study real-life, work based case studies and complete projects and assignments, which contribute to achieving each unit studied. Opportunities include physiotherapy, midwifery, radiologist, social work, teaching, nursing, medicine, counselling etc.
<b>Career options</b>	The qualification is designed to be flexible to reflect the individual's career aspiration. There is an emphasis on employment opportunities, so that students can choose to progress into specific area of work.
